

Wead Library Report 2/24/2025

Each book sale seems to run more smoothly than the last and this Winter Book Sale was no exception. It ran from January 31 - February 8th. Our tweaked procedures, diligent staff and volunteers are the reason. We had a record 19 students participate in the sale's set-up and earn community service credit. The Free Trader and Malone Telegram once again generously helped publicize the sale. Our veteran volunteers L Marshall, B Winthrop-Benware, J Chatland, D Trickey, J Leclerc, and C Eggsware were vital to the sale's success. It was encouraging to see so many book lovers brave the cold weather to attend the first two days. The total for the sale was \$700 with Friday taking in \$500 and Saturday \$87.

The Worker's Compensation Payroll Reporting Form was completed and submitted to the auditing company earlier this month. I am still awaiting word from M Spofford at CEFLS on the 2023 Comptroller's Report. In my absence, the 2024 Annual Report was submitted to CEFLS by N Andre meeting their deadline.

Adirondack Alarms installed the new wireless monitor at the front desk and I have received positive feedback from the staff. Public computer #2 is no longer working. One of the two public laptops has been set up in its place for now. Superior Glass is trying to get pricing on a new crash bar for the ramp entrance on the main floor. The snow on the front roof is monitored daily and patrons are diverted to the ramp entrance if necessary. Since the colder weather settled in, the latch on the Park Street door has also been sticking. Superior Snow Services has hauled away a second massive pile of snow from the back parking lot. A large snow heave has also developed in the parking lot splitting the blacktop. We will see what it looks like in the spring, which cannot come soon enough.
